

Jesus' desire and prayer for the church is that we all be united as one worshiping in Spirit and truth (John 4:24ⁱ). Too often, we get bogged down in attitudes, personalities and preferences and even in how to go about doing God's will, when the real reason we gather is to worship the Lord and focus on Him (Psalm 29:2ⁱⁱ). I trust you are here this morning to see Jesus in His Word. The natural outcome of true worship does edify and build us up in our most holy faith, and that happens when the focus is Jesus (Jude 20,21ⁱⁱⁱ). When Jesus is our focus, we participate in His love for each other. He is what makes us one and brings a unity to all our diversity. **When together our focus is on Him alone, we experience oneness** (Ephesians 4:5,6^{iv}).

Can you recall some of the best worship times at church? What made it so wonderful? Why was it memorable? I think you will answer like every Christian, "It was when the Lord was made very real to me. I sensed His love for me in a deeper way. I saw Him more clearly. In a greater way than ever before I understood His personal desire for me." Like the prophets Isaiah or Ezekiel, you were awed by the wonder of God (Isaiah 6:5^v; Ezekiel 1:28^{vi}). Words were inadequate to describe the impression in your heart, the adoration you felt for Him.

Man can orchestrate emotional highs, but a greater revelation of Jesus comes when hearts are hungering for Him, and the power of the Spirit reveals Him through the Word. Worship happens when we see Him more clearly. That is greater than our personal daily needs and desires, our preferences and tastes. **Every other preference must be set aside for the all-consuming passion to know Jesus.**

In John 4:19-26^{vii} the woman at the well tried to change the subject Jesus had brought up. He had just told her about her sin, and she wanted to avoid that by discussing religious differences. The beauty in that account is that Jesus prompted her to see Him, His forgiveness, grace, and mercy. All the religious differences became insignificant. It is not that they are unimportant. Doctrine is essential. It keeps us from going after a false Messiah. But when we see Jesus, we get a hunger for His Word and doctrine falls in line and eventually gets straightened out. The peripheral issues take second place to the glory and wonder of Jesus. As Watchman Nee wrote, **"Jesus is the sum of all spiritual things!"** Spirituality that does not focus on Jesus, who is the Word made flesh, is deception.

The letters to the churches in chapters 2 and 3 all started with a revelation of Jesus. Just getting a glimpse of those descriptions of Him would have set each church straight, but Jesus went on to explain what that revelation meant in practical terms, whether a rebuke or a commendation or both. Revelation above all else reveals Jesus, for the very first verse declares the book to be a revelation of Jesus Christ (1:1^{viii}). In this chapter we are going to see Him as many of us have never seen Him before.

The churches of what is now southern Turkey were undergoing a time of uncertainty. The Roman Empire had declared that Christianity was not a sanctioned religion. While many areas did nothing about it, the threat of annihilation hung over their heads. But as we can see in the letters, there was a greater danger. It was the danger of affluence and false teaching. Like today, compromise with the culture through false teaching or simply giving in to the temptations of the world was threatening to extinguish the light of the church in those cities. They needed a vision for what was to come, to realize the finality of this world's systems and the eternity of God's kingdom.

¹ Then I saw in the right hand of him who was seated on the throne a scroll written within and on the back, sealed with seven seals. ² And I saw a strong angel proclaiming with a loud voice, "Who is worthy to open the scroll and break its seals?" Revelation 5:1,2 In Chapter 4 John went through that heavenly door and saw the throne room of heaven. We are introduced to the four living creatures who declare God's praises as they fly around the throne (4:6^{ix}). We learn of the 24 elders and their continual declaration of the worthiness of the One on the throne, for all things were created by Him, and through Him, and for Him (4:11^x). The One on the throne is God Almighty, a spirit, but who we see in the midst of the throne is Jesus.

In the first verse, a hand comes out from the glory over the throne with a scroll written on both sides with seven seals. A strong angel, (that is repetitive!) asks so powerfully that all of heaven and earth can hear, *"Who is worthy to open the scroll and break its seals?"*

How worthy do you have to be? First, you must be worthy enough to approach God. Jesus makes all believers worthy in that regard. (Ephesians 2:18^{xi}) But this is more than that. This scroll brings the end of man's governments, the wrath of God, and the establishment of God's physical kingdom on earth (12:10^{xii}). How worthy do you have to be to do that? Until that is accomplished, sin will continue to cause untold suffering through age after age.

³ And no one in heaven or on earth or under the earth was able to open the scroll or to look into it, ⁴ and I began to weep loudly because no one was found worthy to open the scroll or to look into it. Revelation 5:3 Who can put an end to all the pain in the world that sin has caused? When we get just a slight understanding of the enormity of suffering, we weep with John. I do not want to even see the pictures of the barbarism that took place in Southern Israel. How many people have lost those dearest to them in Ukraine, Russia, Israel, and Gaza? Imagine the anguish of knowing your loved one was a hostage in Gaza, or reclaiming the body of an unrecognizable relative who was massacred? And that is only a tiny fraction of the anguish and suffering taking place in this world. Think of all the silent suffering from unfaithful spouses, relatives that won't speak to each other, debilitating illnesses, abuse, human trafficking, and on and on. It is a fallen world!

Atheists see the suffering and use it as an argument against God's existence. How strange, when in fact it is the absence of godliness that has brought this suffering. It can only end when God again reigns in the hearts all and sin is banished from our hearts and minds (21:4^{xiii}). Is there no one who is worthy to open the scroll? Is there no one in heaven or on earth who can vanquish sin? Will this suffering go on forever? It is no wonder he was weeping. We should be weeping for the pain and suffering sin causes.

To be worthy to open the scrolls One would first need to reconcile all who would come to God by faith and make a way for them to be eternally righteous (Hebrews 9:15^{xiv}). That One must be worthy to judge sin (Hebrews 9:26^{xv}). Who could do such a thing but God alone? And so, the Word became flesh in Christ Jesus, the Lamb of God, the only begotten Son of God. He alone lived the perfect demands of the Law and was worthy to be a sacrifice to atone for the sins of all who receive His gift. His perfect life and sacrificial death, and finishing the work God gave Him to do, made Him worthy to open the seals. He reconciled what was separated in the Garden of Eden. He paid the wages of sin Himself (Romans 6:23^{xvi}). He alone can judge righteously. Opening the seals also means dealing with sin in the unrepentant by eternally separating them from the

presence of God, which is the second death (21:8^{xvii}). What prompts a hallelujah shout to us brings a scream of rage from those who reject the love of God.

⁵ And one of the elders said to me, "Weep no more; behold, the Lion of the tribe of Judah, the Root of David, has conquered, so that he can open the scroll and its seven seals." Revelation 5:5 One of the elders told John that there was no need to keep weeping over the ongoing destruction of sin. The Messiah had conquered! The Lion of the tribe of Judah and the Root of David are Messianic titles for the One who God promised would reign forever (Genesis 49:9^{xviii}; Isaiah 11:10^{xix}). The righteous eternal king had conquered. What had He conquered? Sin and death were defeated by His own death in our place. He had conquered Satan and the entire demonic realm (Colossians 2:15^{xx}). He had displayed the power of unending love (1Corinthians 13:8^{xxi}). He had shown that mercy prevails over judgment (James 2:13^{xxii}). Weep no more fellow believers. Our God reigns. He is merciful *and* He is just. The end of sin and the suffering it causes is coming.

Now for the surprising image that must have confused John for a moment, *⁶ And between the throne and the four living creatures and among the elders I saw a Lamb standing, as though it had been slain, with seven horns and with seven eyes, which are the seven spirits of God sent out into all the earth.* Revelation 5:6 We should picture this scene as best we can in our mind's eye. The throne of God is the mercy seat on the Ark of the Covenant. The 24 elders surround the throne in worship. Around them fly the four living creatures singing the praises of God's holiness. From among the elders, steps forward a lamb as it had been slain.^{xxiii} In the first chapter we saw He was among the candlesticks that represent the churches. He is in the midst of the believers. Mentioning he was in their midst points back to chapter two where He was in the midst of the lampstands, the churches (2:1^{xxiv}). I believe these elders represent the Old and New Testament saints, the people of faith. He is with us to the end of the age (Matthew 28:20^{xxv}).

We had that beautiful and moving painting of the lamb in the art show downstairs. It depicted a lamb with its throat cut to drain its blood. The word for "slain" here is the same word used for "sacrifice". It was the gentlest way that the priest could end its life. Around the lamb were the words that had defined the lives of people who were redeemed, words like lust, greed, hate, murder, unforgiveness, written in their own hand. Students of the Word should instantly think of numerous Scriptures, from the Law (Exodus 12:3-6^{xxvi}), the prophets (Isaiah 53:7^{xxvii}), the Gospels (John 1:29^{xxviii}), and the letters (1Peter 1:19^{xxix}), as this scene is overflowing with theological significance. Jesus, the Lamb of God who takes away the sins of the world. All the sacrificial lambs in Israelite history all looked forward to this voluntary act of our Savior, taking the justice that we deserve.

Many churches today have set aside the need for atonement and call it an outdated and barbaric thought. They ask what kind of a God would kill His Son for others? That is because they are ignoring the horror of sin, the greatness of God's love, and the fact that Jesus conquered death and hell in the process. They call good evil and evil good (Isaiah 5:20^{xxx}). No wonder they are horrified by the need for a sacrificial substitution. They have convinced themselves they have done no wrong. The word sin has no meaning to them. Atheists argue that pain and suffering mean there cannot be a loving God, and the liberal Christians argue that pain and suffering are not the result of sin. **Towering over all their denials is the cross of Jesus**, the Lamb that was slain to redeem us. (Matthew 26:28^{xxxi}) He is the Passover Lamb that saves us from the second death. And all He asks

of us is that we humbly repent and receive the gift of eternal life. His eyes see every soul. His Spirit, the Holy Spirit, woos every heart on the entire earth, in the past, now, and until the last day (John 1:9^{xxxii}). His seven horns tell us He has all power to judge the world, and these seals He is about to open are filled with those judgments. His seven eyes represent the fact that nothing is hidden from Him (Hebrews 4:13^{xxxiii}).

⁷ And he went and took the scroll from the right hand of him who was seated on the throne. ⁸ And when he had taken the scroll, the four living creatures and the twenty-four elders fell down before the Lamb, each holding a harp, and golden bowls full of incense, which are the prayers of the saints. Revelation 5:7,8 There is a great sense of anticipation as all of history is about to culminate in the opening of these seals on the scroll that the Lamb has just received. The response of the elders and the living creatures is to fall down before the Lamb. Finally! There is a worthy One! How holy He must be!

The legend of King Arthur draws from this passage. Arthur was the only one that could pull the sword from the stone, meaning he was the one destined to save the kingdom and reign. In a similar sense the Lamb taking the scroll from Almighty God means that He alone is worthy (Daniel 7:13-14^{xxxiv}). He has redeemed His bride. He has conquered death. He has fulfilled the will of the Father and made restoration with man possible (Romans 5:10^{xxxv}). Evil will be vanquished forever. Justice will prevail upon the earth. Everyone who has cried out, "Why is there no justice?" will finally see it meted out. And best of all, the King will reign in righteousness, forever (Isaiah 32:1^{xxxvi})!

These elders have harps to accompany their praise and bowls filled with the prayers of God's people. The prayers are compared to incense (Psalm 141:2^{xxxvii}). That, too, is imagery out of the tabernacle (Exodus 33:15^{xxxviii}). I love the fact that the Lamb was in their midst, for He is not ashamed to call us brothers (Hebrews 2:11^{xxxix}). He is in our midst even now while we try to grasp His greatness!

⁹ And they sang a new song, saying, "Worthy are you to take the scroll and to open its seals, for you were slain, and by your blood you ransomed people for God from every tribe and language and people and nation, ¹⁰ and you have made them a kingdom and priests to our God, and they shall reign on the earth." Revelation 5:9,10 Can you see Jesus as a Lamb that was sacrificed, holding the scroll with seven seals and the chorus of living creatures and 24 elders with their harps singing this song to the worthiness of the Lamb? Remember that the voice of the cherubim can make the threshold of the temple shake (Isaiah 6:4^{xl}). I do not think these harps need amplifiers. They are God created instruments of praise. And the voices of these elders come from their heavenly bodies!

The reason they sing is because they know what it means for the Lamb to receive the scroll. They know His sacrificial death ransomed people from every corner of the globe to be a kingdom of priests to reign on the earth. Those who will reign are a diverse and holy nation of priests whose sin debt was paid by the blood of the Lamb (7:9^{xli}). Henceforth all justice will be righteous. No more corrupt politicians! Hallelujah! All that God intended will be clear and undeniable. All doctrinal issues settled. All false gods revealed as a lie. And they will reign with Christ for a thousand years (20:6^{xlii}). Worthy is the Lamb! The song comes from the overwhelmed hearts around the throne, voices of men and angels. The threshold is shaking as this song in perfect thundering harmonies reverberates throughout the heavenlies. But the chorus is just beginning to rise.

¹¹ Then I looked, and I heard around the throne and the living creatures and the elders the voice of many angels, numbering myriads of myriads and thousands of

thousands, ¹² saying with a loud voice, “Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing!” Revelation 5:11,12 Joining this majestic chorus is more than ten thousands of ten thousands which is a hundred million, all with their God given vocals designed for praise, and they are not holding back. If they wondered what God was doing up to this point (1Peter 1:12^{xliii}), it is now becoming clear, and the glory of His nature is revealed in this Lamb standing among the elders. The say with a loud voice, *“Worthy is the Lamb who was slain, to receive power and wealth and wisdom and might and honor and glory and blessing!”* The focus of heaven is Jesus! Heaven is fixated in awe on how worthy He is as He brings about the will of His Father with utter dedication and surrender to Him. It is this surrender to the goodness and righteousness of God that makes Him worthy to receive power, for He will only use power in a just and holy way (John 5:22^{xliv}). He is worthy to receive all wealth, for His benevolence is always distributed in righteous ways (1Chronicles 29:12^{xlv}; Romans 11:36^{xlvi}). He is worthy to receive all wisdom, for He will only use that wisdom in accord with the goodness of God (Daniel 2:20^{xlvii}). He is worthy of all honor for He is the only One who obeyed the Father in every detail, and we are recipients of the fruit of that obedience (John 17:4^{xlviii}) He is worthy of all glory for His life perfectly displayed the attributes of God. (Hebrews 1:3^{xlix}). And He is worthy of all blessing, for the blessings He receives He distributes with wisdom (Psalm 103:2¹).

Heaven is filled with resounding praise. It is rising to a crescendo! And now all created things that have breath, all beings that have lungs that bring air over their vocal cords, join the heavenly choir. ^{13a} *And I heard every creature in heaven and on earth and under the earth and in the sea, and all that is in them, saying, “To him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor and glory and might forever and ever!”* Revelation 5:13a

Narnia may not be so farfetched after all (Psalm 150:6^{li}). As all heaven sings, the birds will sing, and the whales join in, and the lions will roar, and we all will join them all to praise God and the Lamb for their grace, mercy, love, and righteousness. It is a song that will fill the universe! God used a gentle Lamb, the Lamb of God, to slay a dragon, to redeem us from the powerful chains of sin (12:9,10^{lii}). He is about to put an end to evil and renew the earth. It is the eternal Thanksgiving! Goodness reigns. Truth prevails. *“To him who sits on the throne and to the Lamb be blessing and honor and glory and might forever and ever!”* ¹⁴ *And the four living creatures said, “Amen!” and the elders fell down and worshiped.* Revelation 5:13b,14 Those magnificent living creatures thunder out a resounding “Yes!” Which is the same as saying, “Let it be so!” Heaven’s focus is Jesus, the worthy One! Weep no more church! Suffering and sin will soon be over. All that is lost will be restored. Righteousness will reign. What else is there to do but join in worship with the elders, the seraphim, and everything that has breath? Open the seals, Lord Jesus! Let sin be no more. Finish the work you started in us. Bring us home!
